### Homegoing Guidelines for



Everyone, sooner or later will find themselves dealing with the grief that comes from the passing of a loved one in death. The believers at Ebenezer stand ready to assist anyone who needs our help and counsel.

#### WHAT TO DO WHEN YOUR LOVED ONE DIES

- 1. Contact Other Family Members and Close Friends
- 2. Contact Your Church
- 3. Notify employer of the deceased and your own employer
- 4. If children are in school, notify the school
- 5. Choose a Funeral Home
- 6. Locate Insurance policy and contact the insurance company

Before going to the Funeral Home to make arrangements... It will save you considerable time and phone calls if you have the following information available.

- 1. Full name of deceased (include nickname or other names person may have used).
- 2. Date of Birth
- 3. Place of Birth
- 4. Spouse's Name / Next of Kin
- 1. Father's Name
- 2. Mother's Name (Maiden)
- 3. List of relatives and relationship to the deceased
- 7. List of church, professional organizations, clubs and other organizations in which membership was held
- 8. If you wish, indicate memorial to be designated in obituary in memory of the deceased
- 9. If a memorial or Homegoing service is announced in the newspapers, take extra precaution for security at the home of the deceased during the indicated time of the service.

The following information will be needed for the Funeral Home and for the planning of the service.

| Making the arrangements:  |
| Ebenezer will do our best to work with the family to find a time that is convenient for both the needs of the family and the scheduled programs. We ask that BEFORE the arrangements are finalized or made public that the times be cleared by either the officiating pastor or the administrative secretary.   |
| The church will not cancel any major planned events (weddings, conferences, workshops, etc) to accommodate a Homegoing service. We invite families to consider evening viewings and services (such as 5pm to 7pm viewing, followed by a 7pm service, with interment the next morning) as this may helpful for other family and friends who are unable to get off of work. |
| Facilities:   |
| Ebenezer AME Church of Rahway has a sanctuary seating of 400 to 450 people comfortably and is located on the main level of the church, which has a ramp and is handicap accessible.   |

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In addition to the Sanctuary, Ebenezer has several rooms that can accommodate a repast meal for the family (10 to 200 people) following the Homegoing/memorial service. The fellowship hall is located on the lower level of the church and is handicap accessible via a ramp on the rear of the church

#### **Clergy Services:**

A member of Ebenezer's ministerial staff will be available to officiate and/or deliver the Eulogy at the Homegoing/memorial service. The ordained clerics of Ebenezer believe that Homegoings are a part of their call to ministry. We count it both a great responsibility and a great privilege to be with families in their moment of need, offering through their words, work, and witness the life and love of Jesus Christ.

We also acknowledge that some families wish to honor pastors/clergy with an honorarium. As many families are uncertain about an appropriate amount, please find a general guide enclosed in this document.

The family is welcome to select an outside minister to officiate or deliver the eulogy, if desired. This person must be approved by the Pastor and the family is responsible for making contact with that minister and ensuring that they make contact with the Pastor of Ebenezer prior to the service.

PLEASE NOTE: It is totally at the family's discretion as to whether or not they choose to provide an honorarium to the participating ministerial staff. It is also totally at the family's discretion, should they choose to provide an honorarium, to follow the guideline suggested below or to determine other amounts they deem appropriate.

#### Music:

Ebenezer has several musicians that can be made available for Homegoing/memorial services. All musical arrangements (pianist, soloist, etc.) must be discussed with the Pastor.

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Obituary

Former Rahway resident William Floyd "Bill" Smith, 63, was called from labor to reward on Dec. 16, 2000, at his home in Rahway, NJ. Brother Smith was born Jan. 25, 1937, in Chehalis, Wash., to Louis F. and Lydia M. (Merrill) Smith. He graduated from Olympia High School in 1955 and Kean College in 1960 with a B.S. in engineering.

He married Pauline LaTouche on July 15, 1967, in Williamsport and two children were raised from this union. He came to Fort Richardson in the 1950s while serving in the U.S. Army as a communications technician. After his discharge, he was employed by Chevron USA as an engineer technologist for 28 years, retiring in 1987. He coached Little League softball for 10 years in Anchorage. He had lived in Anchorage for 40 years when he moved to Aurora in 1995.

In retirement, he enjoyed woodworking and especially wood art. Mr. Smith was a member of Chevron Retirees Association and the American Association of Retired Persons.
